E-Statement Disclosure Agreement

E-Statements versus Paper Statements

- You may remove your accounts from E-Statements and receive paper statements at any time.
- You may not receive both E-Statements and paper statements at the same time.
- Your authorization will only apply to accounts listed on the authorization form.
- If at any time while receiving e-statements you would like to request a paper statement you may do so at our office however, duplicate statements fees will apply.

Accessing E-Statements

- We will send your statements to the email address you provided on the authorization form for each statement period.

Joint Account Holders

- If any of the joint holders of an account enroll the account in E-Statements, that account holder will receive E-Statements for the account, and paper statements will no longer be sent for the account. If the other joint account holders wish to receive a statement they must also enroll in E-Statements for the account.
- If a joint account holder wishes to receive paper statements again, all of the account holders on the account must select paper statements before E-Statements will be replaced with paper statements

Statement Inserts

- Any legal inserts (policy changes, account notices, privacy information, etc) will be included with your E-Statements or provided in a separate mailing.

Computer Requirements

- You will need a computer with internet browser software and adobe Acrobat Reader to access you E-Statements.
- You will need a valid email address enrolled to receive your E-Statement
- You will need a printer if you choose to print your E-Statement.

Invalid Email Addresses

- By agreeing to this disclosure, you are required to maintain a valid email address with us.
- Should your email address change from when you initially established E-Statements, you may change the address by contacting the bank at supportfsmc@springnet1.com or through a secure message thru the banks website.

Security

- To prevent unauthorized persons from viewing your account information a password will be required to view your statement.
- This password may be retrieved by contacting the bank at 217-482-3285 or via a secured message through the bank website.
- If you save your E-Statements to your computer, you should ensure that you have adequate security measures to prevent unauthorized access to your statements.

Changes/Termination

- We reserve the right, at our sole discretion, to modify our E-Statement service, to change the conditions under which we will provide this service, or to terminate your service
- Prior to any such change or termination, we will provide you with any advance notice required by law.

Agreement to Receive E-Statements

- By accepting the terms of this E-Statement Disclosure and Agreement and enrolling an account in E-Statements, you agree and consent that we may provide periodic statements for that account to your electronically via e-mail.
- You may withdraw your consent and revoke your agreement to receive periodic statements for an account electronically via E-Statements by contacting us at supportfsmc@springnet1.com.
